Growth versus decline

 Paradigm of growth: a part of our socialization process and the dominant basis for rational planning of the physical environment, the economy and civil society





• **Decline**: raising awareness of the need in the public spheres of adoption of new mind-sets and adaptation of existing formal and informal structures by considering population decline as providing innovative chances instead of being a threat
